# 7. Soldering and Mounting

#### 7-1. Soldering

Mildly activated rosin fluxes are preferred. TAI-TECH terminations are suitable for all wave and re-flow soldering systems. If hand soldering cannot be avoided, the preferred technique is the utilization of hot air soldering tools.

#### 7-1.1 Solder re-flow:

Recommended temperature profiles for re-flow soldering in Figure 1.

#### 7-1.2 Soldering Iron(Figure 2):

Products attachment with a soldering iron is discouraged due to the inherent process control limitations. In the event that a soldering iron must be employed the following precautions are recommended.

- Preheat circuit and products to 150℃
- Never contact the ceramic with the iron tip
- Use a 20 watt soldering iron with tip diameter of 1.0mm

- 355°C tip temperature (max)
- 1.0mm tip diameter (max)
- Limit soldering time to 4~5 sec.

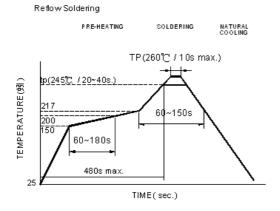
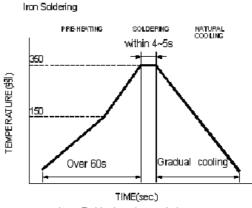




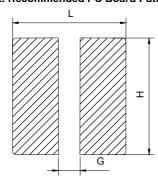

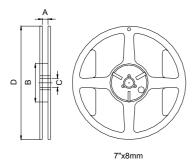
### 7-2. Recommended PC Board Pattern

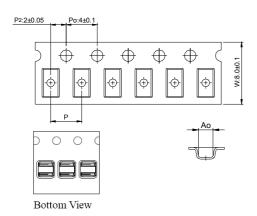

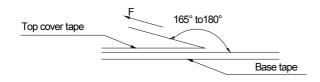
