

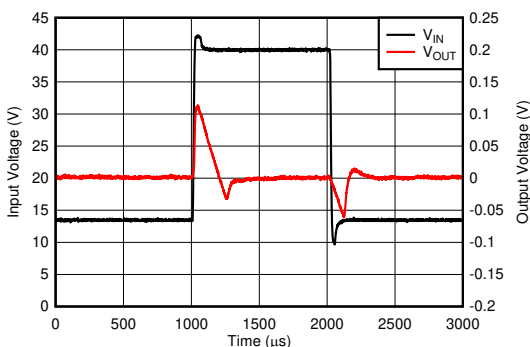
# TPS7B86-Q1 具有电源正常状态指示功能的汽车类 500mA、40V、可调节低压降稳压器

## 1 特性

- 符合面向汽车应用的 AEC-Q100 标准：
  - 温度等级 1：-40°C 至 +125°C， $T_A$
  - 结温：-40°C 至 +150°C， $T_J$
- 输入电压范围：3V 至 40V (最大 42V)

  - 固定输出：3.3V 和 5V
- 最大输出电流：500mA
- 输出电压精度： $\pm 0.85\%$  (最大值)
- 低压降：
  - 450mA 时为 475mV (最大值) ( $V_{OUT} \geq 3.3V$ )

## 3 说明

TPS7B86-Q1 是一款低压降线性稳压器，专用于连接汽车应用中的电池。该器件的输入电压范围高达 40V，因此可承受汽车系统可能发生的瞬变（如负载突降）。此器件在轻负载下的静态电流仅为 17 $\mu A$ ，是为备用系统中微控制器 (MCU) 和控制局域网络 (CAN) 收发器等常开型器件供电的出色解决方案。

该器件具有先进的瞬态响应，因此输出端可对负载或线路变化（例如，在冷启动条件下）作出迅速响应。此外，该器件架构新颖，可在从电压跌落恢复过程中最大限度降低输出过冲幅度。正常运行时，该器件可在整个线路、负载和温度范围内维持  $\pm 0.85\%$  的直流精度。

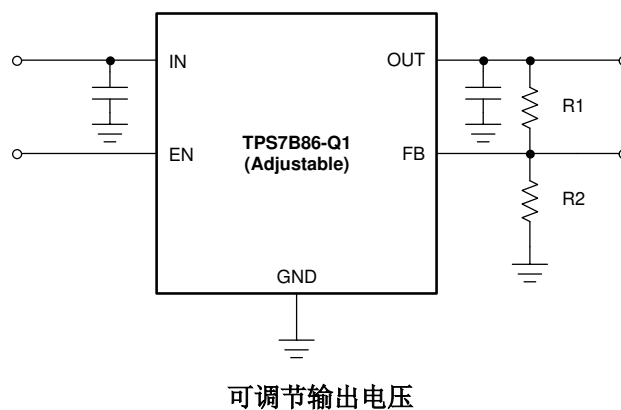
可以通过外部组件调整电源正常状态指示延迟，因此可通过配置延迟时间来适应应用特定的系统。

该器件采用导热封装，因此可将热量高效传导到电路板上。

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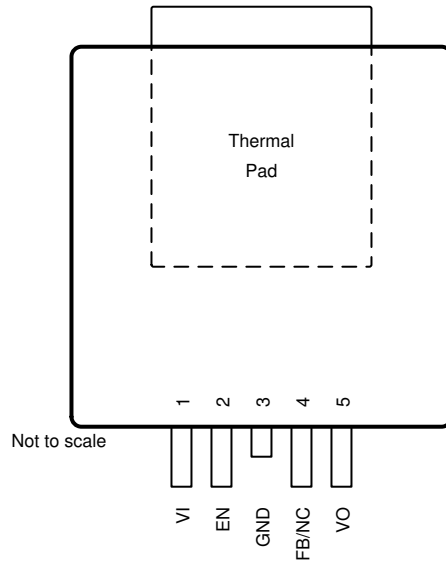

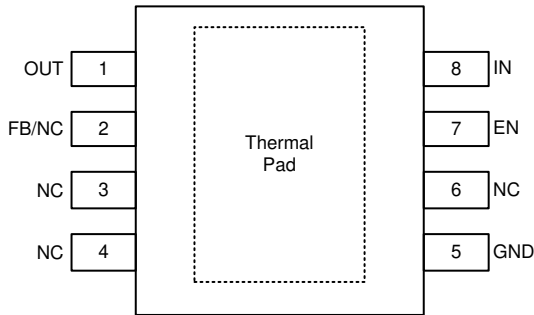

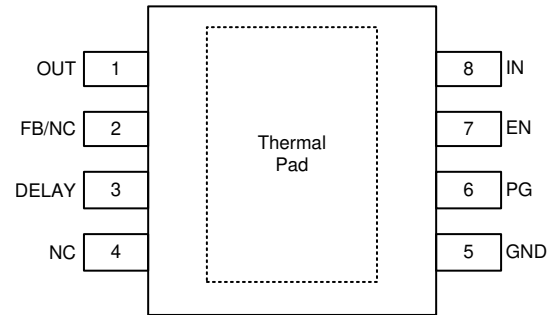

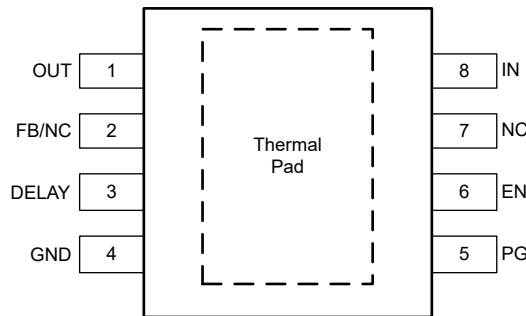
**图 5-1. KVVU Package, 5-Pin TO-252 (Top View)**

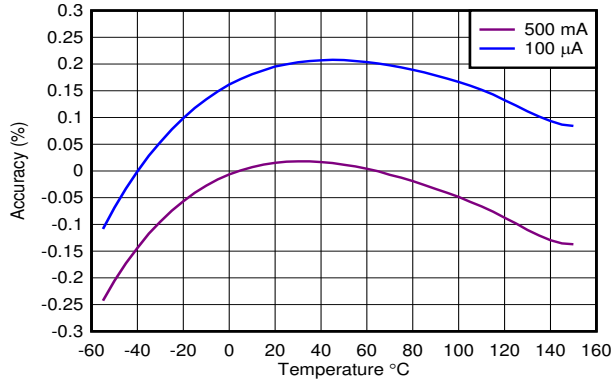
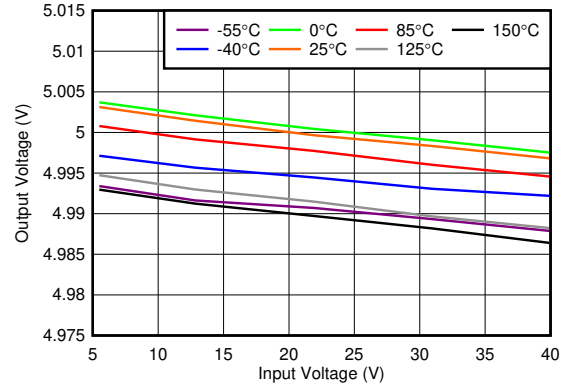
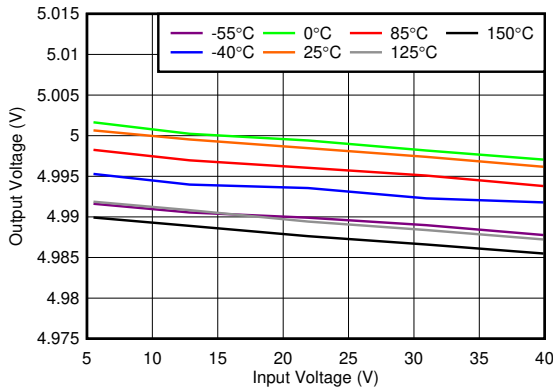


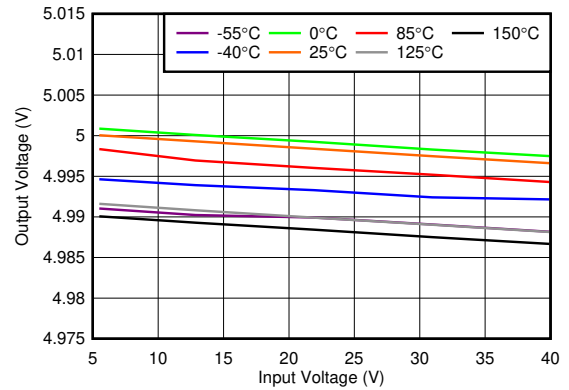
图 6-1. Accuracy vs Temperature



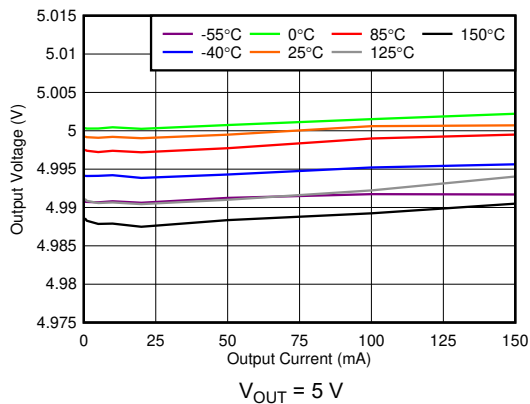

图 6-2. Line Regulation vs  $V_{IN}$



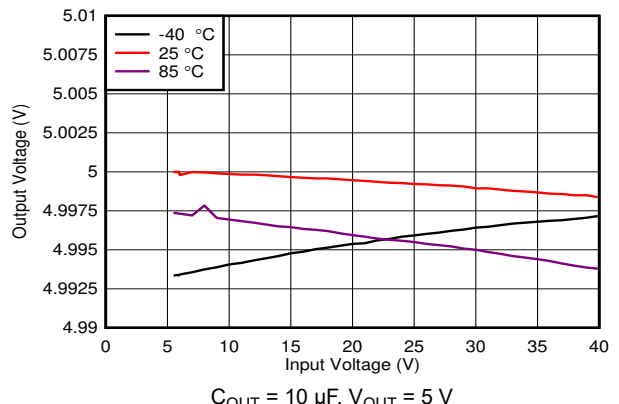

图 6-6. Line Regulation at 50 mA

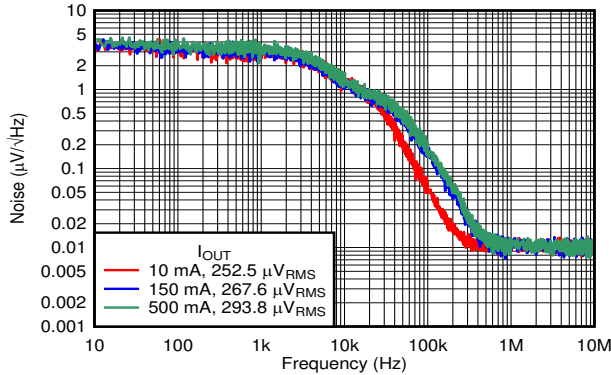

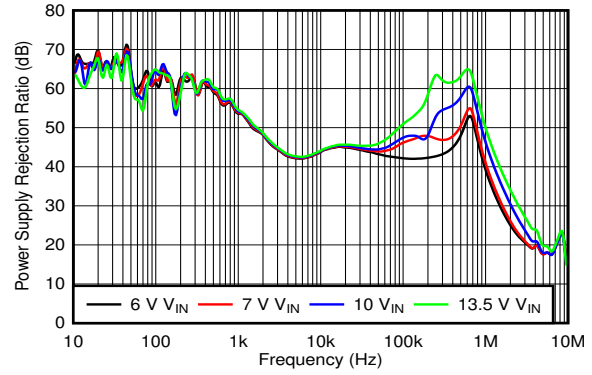

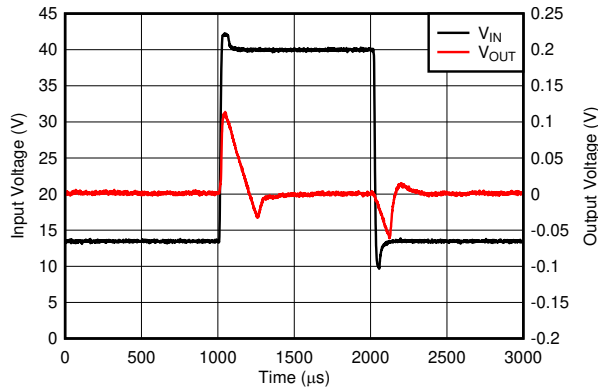

图 6-13. Noise vs Frequency



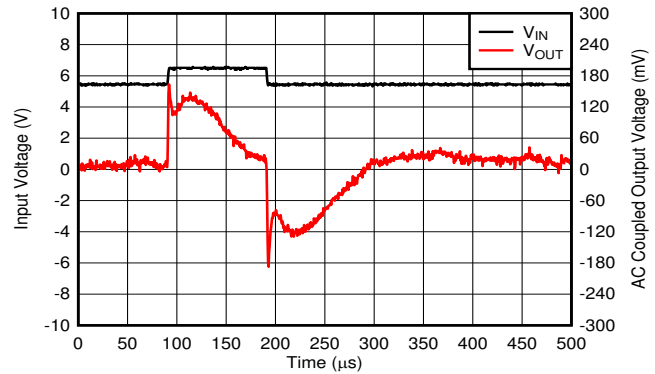

图 6-14. PSRR vs Frequency and  $V_{IN}$



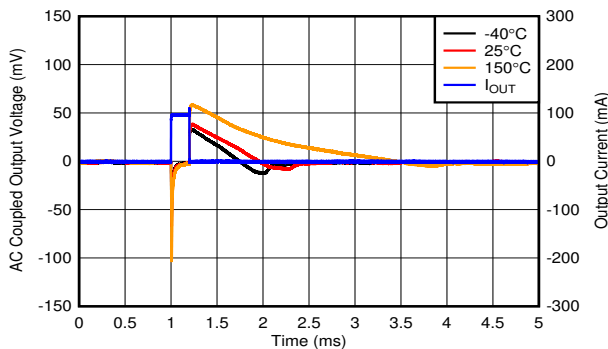

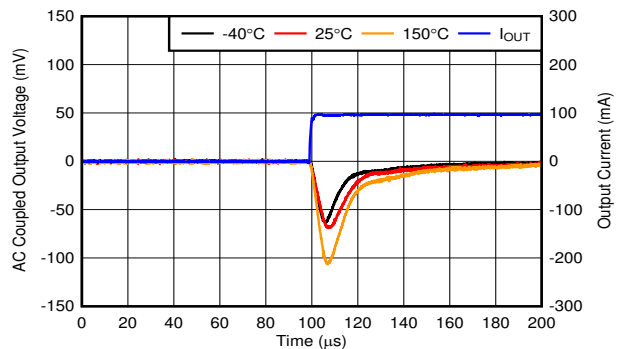

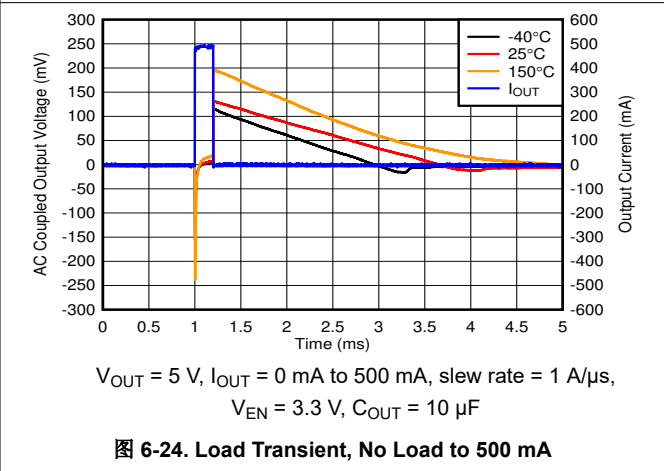

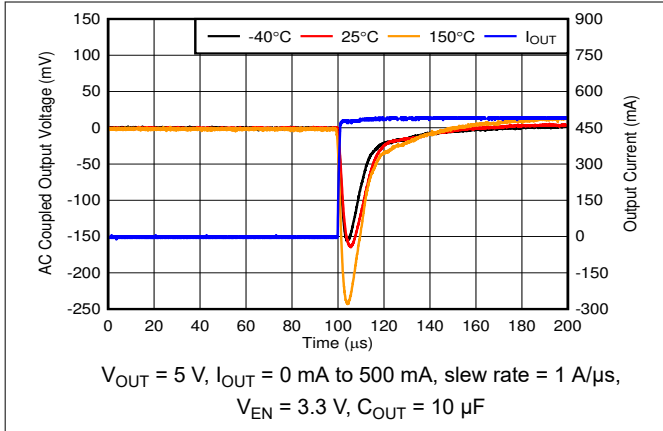


图 6-25. Load Transient, No Load to 500-mA Rising Edge

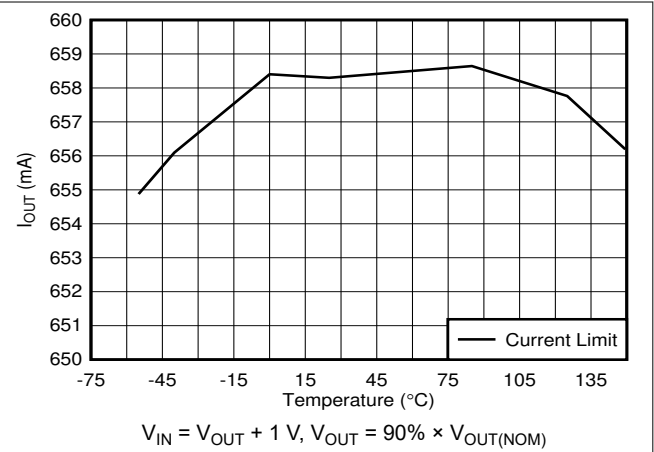


图 6-26. Output Current Limit vs Temperature

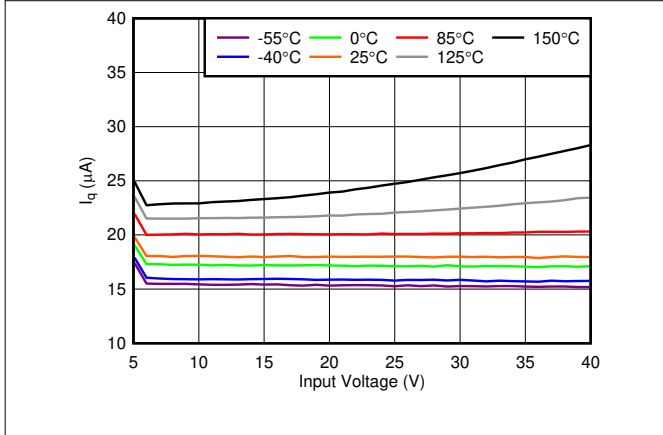


图 6-27. Quiescent Current ( $I_Q$ ) vs  $V_{IN}$

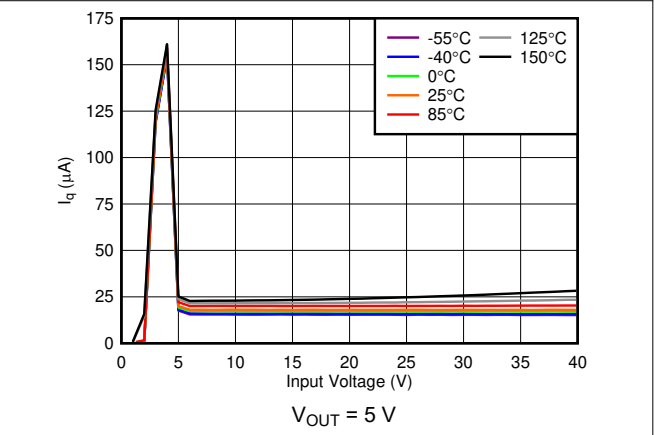


图 6-28. Quiescent Current ( $I_Q$ ) vs  $V_{IN}$

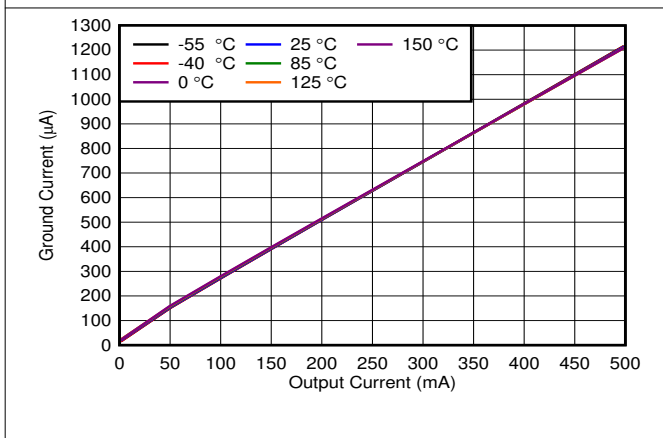


图 6-29. Ground Current ( $I_{GND}$ ) vs  $I_{OUT}$

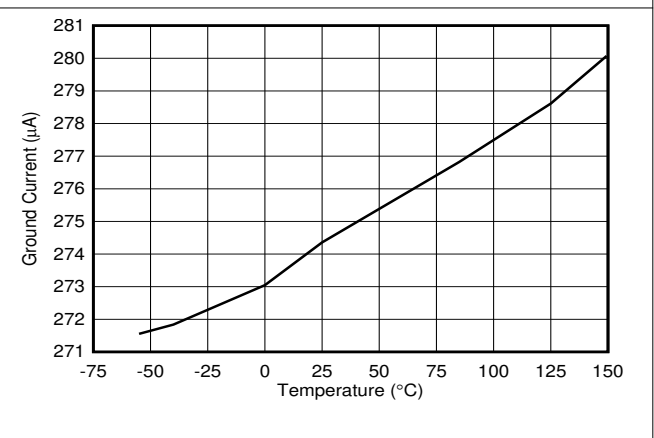


图 6-30. Ground Current at 100 mA

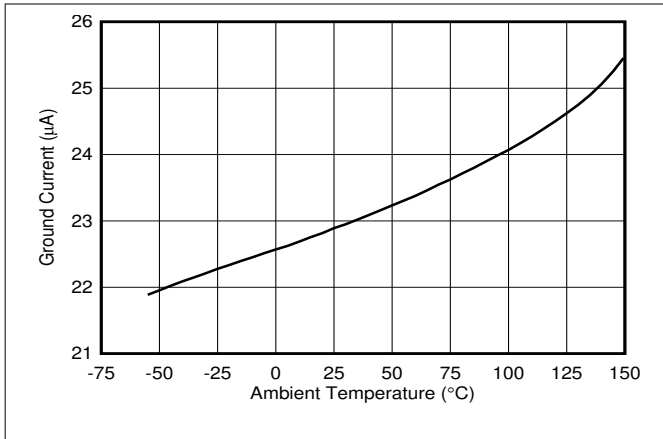


图 6-31. Ground Current at 500  $\mu\text{A}$

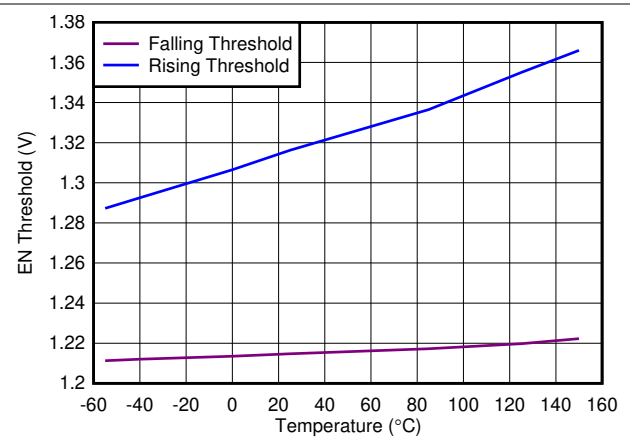


图 6-32. EN Threshold vs Temperature

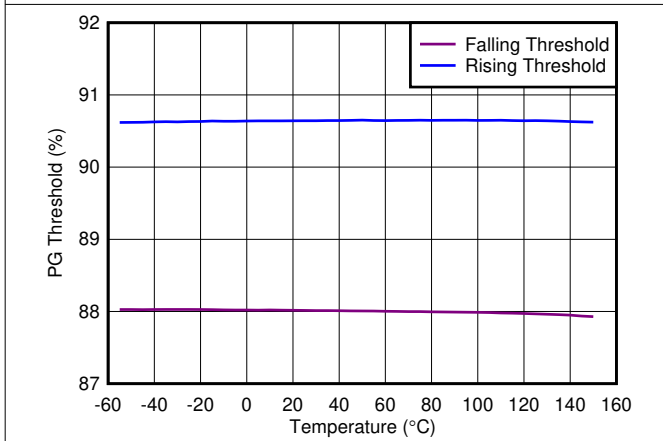


图 6-33. PG Threshold vs Temperature

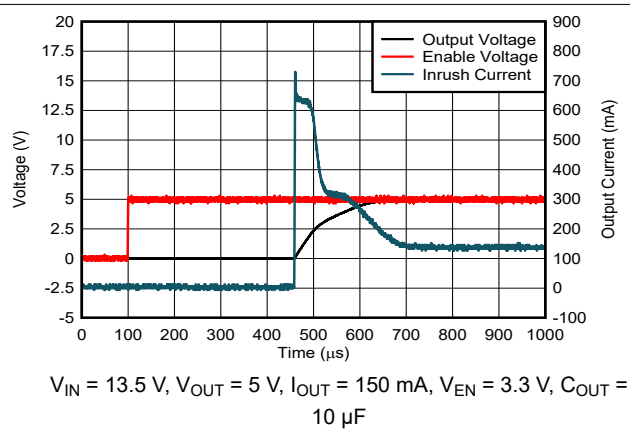


图 6-34. Start-Up Plot Inrush Current

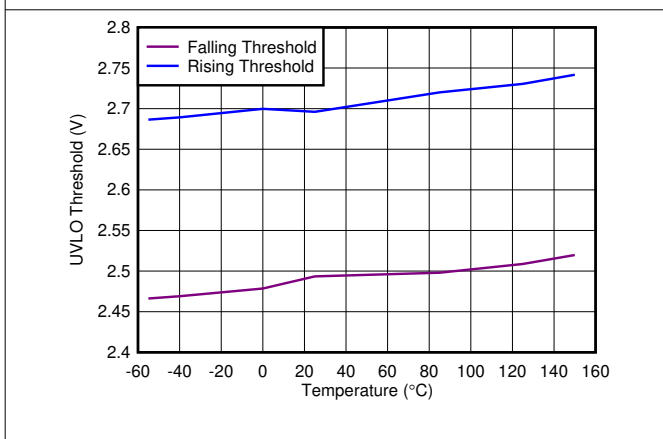


图 6-35. Undervoltage Lockout (UVLO) Threshold vs Temperature

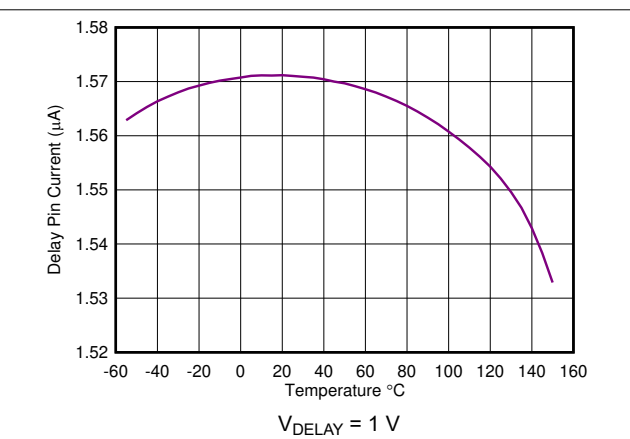


图 6-36. Delay Pin Current vs Temperature

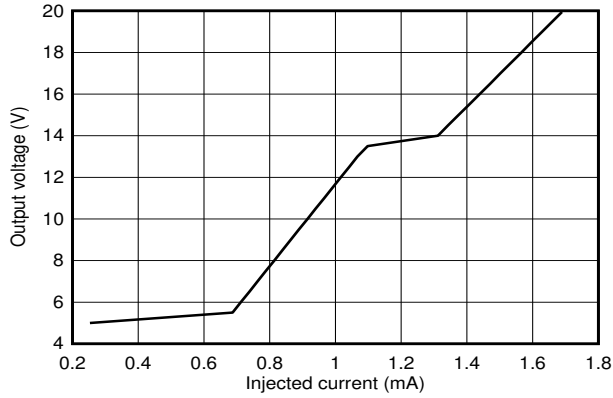


图 6-37. Output Voltage vs Injected Current

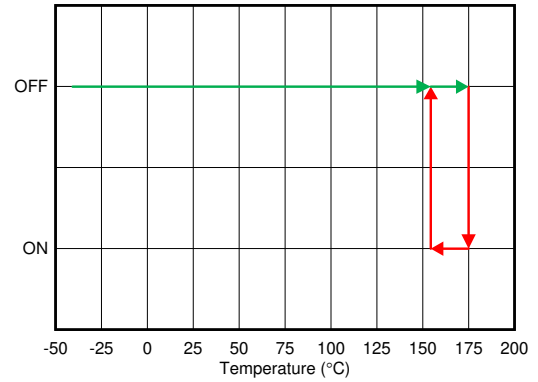


图 6-38. Thermal Shutdown

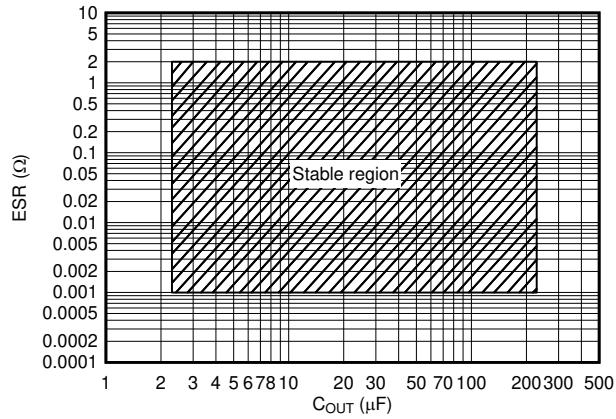


图 6-39. Stability, ESR vs  $C_{OUT}$

## 7 Detailed Description

### 7.1 Overview

The TPS7B86-Q1 is a low-dropout linear regulator (LDO) with improved transient performance that allows for quick response to changes in line or load conditions. The device also features a novel output overshoot reduction feature that minimizes output overshoot during cold-crank conditions.

The integrated power-good and delay features allow for the system to notify down-stream components when the power is good and assist in sequencing requirements.

During normal operation, the device has a tight DC accuracy of  $\pm 0.85\%$  over line, load, and temperature. The increased accuracy allows for the powering of sensitive analog loads or sensors.

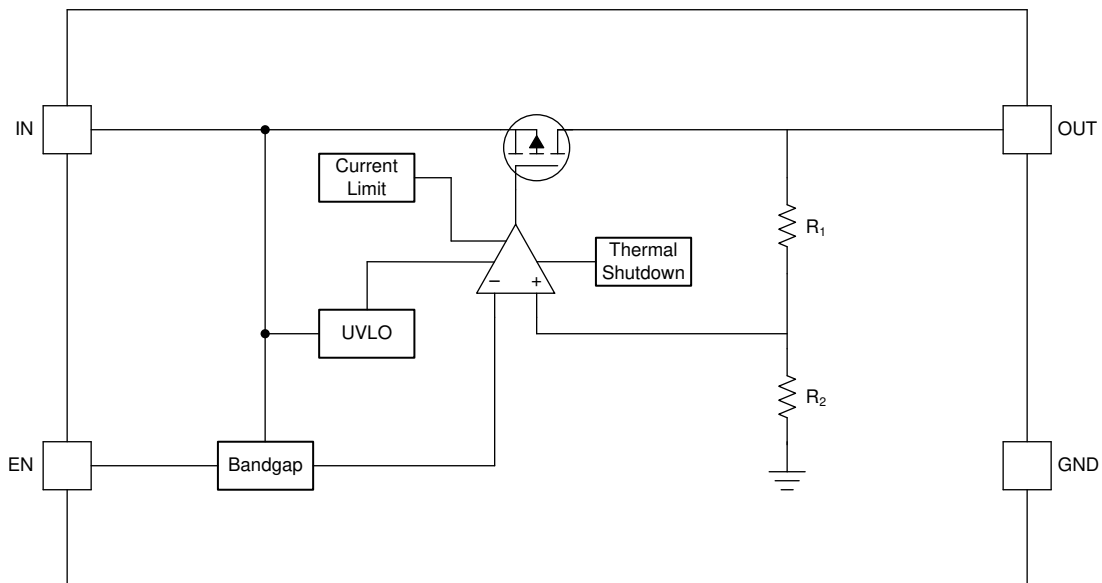


图 7-1. TPS7B86-Q1 Fixed Output Without PG

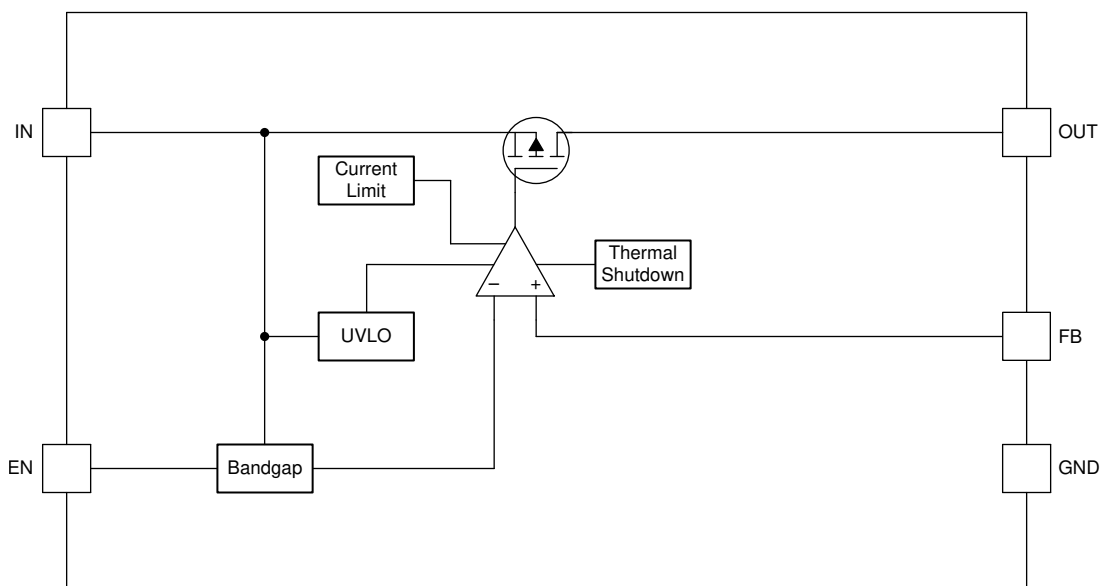


图 7-2. TPS7B86-Q1 Adjustable Output Without PG



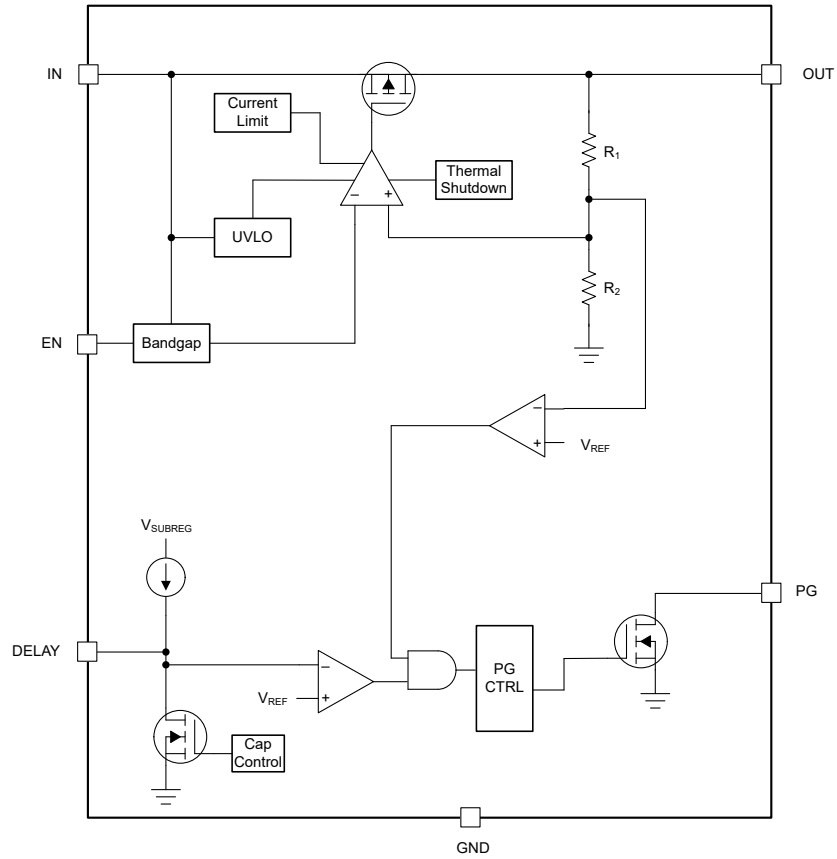


图 7-3. TPS7B86-Q1 With PG

## 7.3 Feature Description

### 7.3.1 Enable (EN)

The enable pin for the device is an active-high pin. The output voltage is enabled when the voltage of the enable pin is greater than the high-level input voltage of the EN pin and disabled with the enable pin voltage is less than the low-level input voltage of the EN pin. If independent control of the output voltage is not needed, connect the enable pin to the input of the device.

### 7.3.2 Power-Good (PG)

The power-good (PG) pin is an open-drain output and can be connected to a regulated supply through an external pullup resistor. The maximum pullup voltage is listed as  $V_{PG}$  in the [Recommended Operating Conditions](#) table. For the PG pin to have a valid output, the voltage on the IN pin must be greater than  $V_{UVLO(RISING)}$ , as listed in the [Electrical Characteristics](#) table. When  $V_{OUT}$  exceeds  $V_{PG(TH, RISING)}$ , the PG output is high impedance and the PG pin voltage pulls up to the connected regulated supply. When the regulated output falls below  $V_{PG(TH, FALLING)}$ , the open-drain output turns on and pulls the PG output low. If output voltage monitoring is not needed, the PG pin can be left floating or connected to ground.

By connecting a pullup resistor to an external supply, any downstream device can receive power-good (PG) as a logic signal that can be used for sequencing. Make sure that the external pullup supply voltage results in a valid logic signal for the receiving device.

### 7.3.3 Adjustable Power-Good Delay Timer (DELAY)

The power-good delay period is a function of the external capacitor on the DELAY pin. The adjustable delay configures the amount of time required before the PG pin becomes high. This delay is configured by connecting an external capacitor from this pin to GND. [图 7-4](#) shows the typical timing diagram for the power-good delay pin. If the DELAY pin is left floating, the power-good delay is  $t_{(DLY\_FIX)}$ . For more information on how to program the PG delay, see the [Setting the Adjustable Power-Good Delay](#) section.

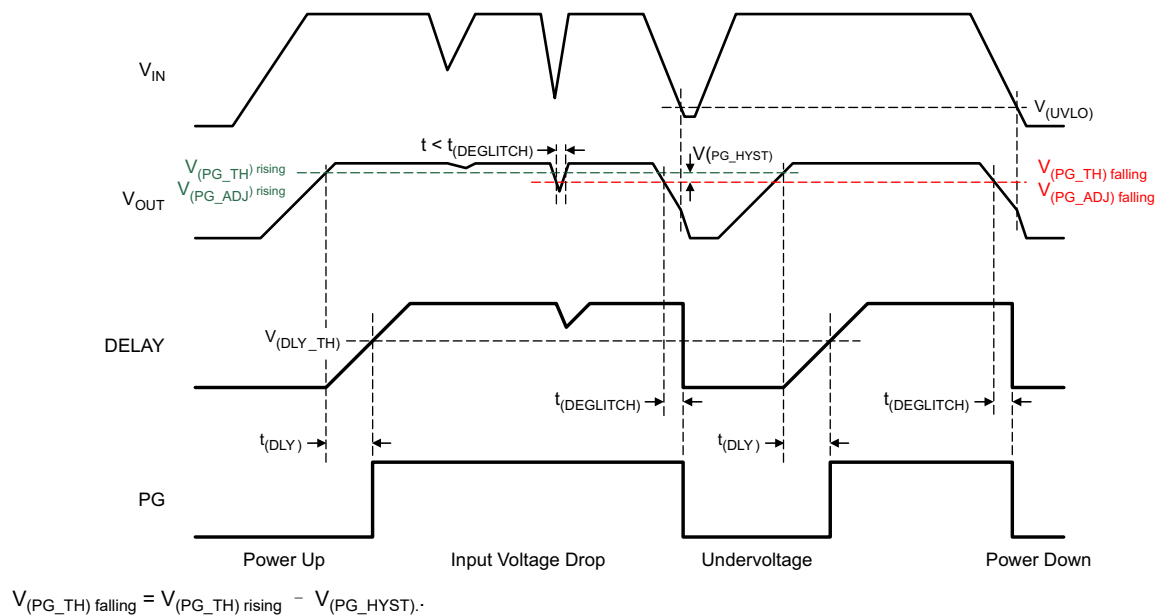


图 7-4. Typical Power-Good Timing Diagram

### 7.3.4 Undervoltage Lockout

The device has an independent undervoltage lockout (UVLO) circuit that monitors the input voltage, allowing a controlled and consistent turn on and off of the output voltage. To prevent the device from turning off if the input drops during turn on, the UVLO has hysteresis as specified in the [Electrical Characteristics](#) table.

### 7.3.5 Thermal Shutdown

The device contains a thermal shutdown protection circuit to disable the device when the junction temperature ( $T_J$ ) of the pass transistor rises to  $T_{SD(\text{shutdown})}$  (typical). Thermal shutdown hysteresis assures that the device resets (turns on) when the temperature falls to  $T_{SD(\text{reset})}$  (typical).

The thermal time-constant of the semiconductor die is fairly short, thus the device may cycle on and off when thermal shutdown is reached until power dissipation is reduced. Power dissipation during start-up can be high from large  $V_{IN} - V_{OUT}$  voltage drops across the device or from high inrush currents charging large output capacitors. Under some conditions, the thermal shutdown protection disables the device before start-up completes.

For reliable operation, limit the junction temperature to the maximum listed in the [Recommended Operating Conditions](#) table. Operation above this maximum temperature causes the device to exceed operational specifications. Although the internal protection circuitry of the device is designed to protect against thermal overall conditions, this circuitry is not intended to replace proper heat sinking. Continuously running the device into thermal shutdown or above the maximum recommended junction temperature reduces long-term reliability.

### 7.3.6 Current Limit

The device has an internal current limit circuit that protects the regulator during transient high-load current faults or shorting events. The current limit is a brick-wall scheme. In a high-load current fault, the brick-wall scheme limits the output current to the current limit ( $I_{CL}$ ).  $I_{CL}$  is listed in the [Electrical Characteristics](#) table.

The output voltage is not regulated when the device is in current limit. When a current limit event occurs, the device begins to heat up because of the increase in power dissipation. When the device is in brick-wall current limit, the pass transistor dissipates power  $[(V_{IN} - V_{OUT}) \times I_{CL}]$ . If thermal shutdown is triggered, the device turns off. After the device cools down, the internal thermal shutdown circuit turns the device back on. If the output current fault condition continues, the device cycles between current limit and thermal shutdown. For more information on current limits, see the [Know Your Limits application note](#).

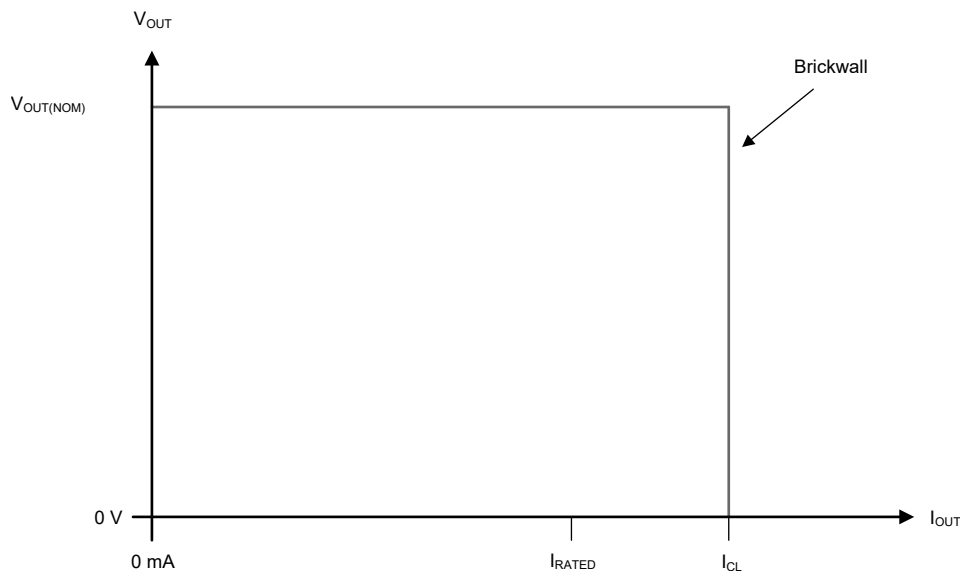


图 7-5. Current Limit

### 7.4.2 Normal Operation

The device regulates to the nominal output voltage when the following conditions are met:

- The input voltage is greater than the nominal output voltage plus the dropout voltage ( $V_{OUT(nom)} + V_{DO}$ )
- The output current is less than the current limit ( $I_{OUT} < I_{CL}$ )
- The device junction temperature is less than the thermal shutdown temperature ( $T_J < T_{SD}$ )
- The enable voltage has previously exceeded the enable rising threshold voltage and has not yet decreased to less than the enable falling threshold

### 7.4.3 Dropout Operation

If the input voltage is lower than the nominal output voltage plus the specified dropout voltage, but all other conditions are met for normal operation, the device operates in dropout mode. In this mode, the output voltage tracks the input voltage. During this mode, the transient performance of the device becomes significantly degraded because the pass transistor is in the ohmic or triode region, and acts as a switch. Line or load transients in dropout can result in large output-voltage deviations.

When the device is in a steady dropout state (defined as when the device is in dropout,  $V_{IN} < V_{OUT(NOM)} + V_{DO}$ , directly after being in a normal regulation state, but *not* during start up), the pass transistor is driven into the ohmic or triode region. When the input voltage returns to a value greater than or equal to the nominal output voltage plus the dropout voltage ( $V_{OUT(NOM)} + V_{DO}$ ), the output voltage can overshoot for a short period of time while the device pulls the pass transistor back into the linear region.

### 7.4.4 Disabled

The output of the device can be shutdown by forcing the voltage of the enable pin to less than the maximum EN pin low-level input voltage (see the [Electrical Characteristics](#) table). When disabled, the pass transistor is turned off and internal circuits are shutdown.

## 8 Application and Implementation

### 8.1 Application Information

#### 8.1.1 Input and Output Capacitor Selection

The TPS7B86-Q1 requires an output capacitor of 2.2  $\mu\text{F}$  or larger (1  $\mu\text{F}$  or larger capacitance) for stability and an equivalent series resistance (ESR) between 0.001  $\Omega$  and 2  $\Omega$ . For best transient performance, use X5R- and X7R-type ceramic capacitors because these capacitors have minimal variation in value and ESR over temperature. When choosing a capacitor for a specific application, be mindful of the DC bias characteristics for the capacitor. Higher output voltages cause a significant derating of the capacitor. For best performance, the maximum recommended output capacitance is 220  $\mu\text{F}$ .

Although an input capacitor is not required for stability, good analog design practice is to connect a capacitor from IN to GND. Some input supplies have a high impedance, thus placing the input capacitor on the input supply helps reduce the input impedance. This capacitor counteracts reactive input sources and improves transient response, input ripple, and PSRR. If the input supply has a high impedance over a large range of frequencies, several input capacitors can be used in parallel to lower the impedance over frequency. Use a higher-value capacitor if large, fast, rise-time load transients are anticipated, or if the device is located several inches from the input power source.

#### 8.1.2 Adjustable Device Feedback Resistor Selection

The adjustable-version device requires external feedback divider resistors to set the output voltage.  $V_{\text{OUT}}$  is set using the feedback divider resistors,  $R_1$  and  $R_2$ , according to the following equation:

$$V_{\text{OUT}} = V_{\text{FB}} \times (1 + R_1 / R_2) \quad (1)$$

To ignore the FB pin current error term in the  $V_{\text{OUT}}$  equation, set the feedback divider current to 100x the FB pin current listed in the [Electrical Characteristics](#) table. This setting provides the maximum feedback divider series resistance, as shown in the following equation:

$$R_1 + R_2 \leq V_{\text{OUT}} / (I_{\text{FB}} \times 100) \quad (2)$$

#### 8.1.3 Feed-Forward Capacitor

For the adjustable-voltage version device, a feed-forward capacitor ( $C_{\text{FF}}$ ) can be connected from the OUT pin to the FB pin.  $C_{\text{FF}}$  improves transient, noise, and PSRR performance, but is not required for regulator stability. Recommended  $C_{\text{FF}}$  values are listed in the [Recommended Operating Conditions](#) table. A higher capacitance  $C_{\text{FF}}$  can be used; however, the start-up time increases. For a detailed description of  $C_{\text{FF}}$  tradeoffs, see the [Pros and Cons of Using a Feedforward Capacitor with a Low-Dropout Regulator application note](#).

$C_{\text{FF}}$  and  $R_1$  form a zero in the loop gain at frequency  $f_z$ , while  $C_{\text{FF}}$ ,  $R_1$ , and  $R_2$  form a pole in the loop gain at frequency  $f_p$ .  $C_{\text{FF}}$  zero and pole frequencies can be calculated from the following equations:

$$f_z = 1 / (2 \times \pi \times C_{\text{FF}} \times R_1) \quad (3)$$

$$f_p = 1 / (2 \times \pi \times C_{\text{FF}} \times (R_1 \parallel R_2)) \quad (4)$$

#### 8.1.4 Dropout Voltage

Dropout voltage ( $V_{\text{DO}}$ ) is defined as the input voltage minus the output voltage ( $V_{\text{IN}} - V_{\text{OUT}}$ ) at the rated output current ( $I_{\text{RATED}}$ ), where the pass transistor is fully on.  $I_{\text{RATED}}$  is the maximum  $I_{\text{OUT}}$  listed in the [Recommended Operating Conditions](#) table. The pass transistor is in the ohmic or triode region of operation, and acts as a switch. The dropout voltage indirectly specifies a minimum input voltage greater than the nominal programmed

output voltage at which the output voltage is expected to stay in regulation. If the input voltage falls to less than the nominal output regulation, then the output voltage falls as well.

For a CMOS regulator, the dropout voltage is determined by the drain-source on-state resistance ( $R_{DS(ON)}$ ) of the pass transistor. Therefore, if the linear regulator operates at less than the rated current, the dropout voltage for that current scales accordingly. The following equation calculates the  $R_{DS(ON)}$  of the device.

$$R_{DS(ON)} = \frac{V_{DO}}{I_{RATED}} \quad (5)$$

### 8.1.5 Reverse Current

Excessive reverse current can damage this device. Reverse current flows through the intrinsic body diode of the pass transistor instead of the normal conducting channel. At high magnitudes, this current flow degrades the long-term reliability of the device.

Conditions where reverse current can occur are outlined in this section, all of which can exceed the absolute maximum rating of  $V_{OUT} \leq V_{IN} + 0.3 \text{ V}$ .

- If the device has a large  $C_{OUT}$  and the input supply collapses with little or no load current
- The output is biased when the input supply is not established
- The output is biased above the input supply

If reverse current flow is expected in the application, external protection is recommended to protect the device. Reverse current is not limited in the device, so external limiting is required if extended reverse voltage operation is anticipated.

### 8.1.6 Power Dissipation ( $P_D$ )

Circuit reliability requires consideration of the device power dissipation, location of the circuit on the printed circuit board (PCB), and correct sizing of the thermal plane. The PCB area around the regulator must have few or no other heat-generating devices that cause added thermal stress.

To first-order approximation, power dissipation in the regulator depends on the input-to-output voltage difference and load conditions. The following equation calculates power dissipation ( $P_D$ ).

$$P_D = (V_{IN} - V_{OUT}) \times I_{OUT} \quad (6)$$

---

#### 备注

Power dissipation can be minimized, and therefore greater efficiency can be achieved, by correct selection of the system voltage rails. For the lowest power dissipation use the minimum input voltage required for correct output regulation.

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For devices with a thermal pad, the primary heat conduction path for the device package is through the thermal pad to the PCB. Solder the thermal pad to a copper pad area under the device. This pad area must contain an array of plated vias that conduct heat to additional copper planes for increased heat dissipation.

The maximum power dissipation determines the maximum allowable ambient temperature ( $T_A$ ) for the device. According to the following equation, power dissipation and junction temperature are most often related by the junction-to-ambient thermal resistance ( $R_{\theta JA}$ ) of the combined PCB and device package and the temperature of the ambient air ( $T_A$ ).

$$T_J = T_A + (R_{\theta JA} \times P_D) \quad (7)$$

Thermal resistance ( $R_{\theta JA}$ ) is highly dependent on the heat-spreading capability built into the particular PCB design, and therefore varies according to the total copper area, copper weight, and location of the planes. The junction-to-ambient thermal resistance listed in the [Thermal Information](#) table is determined by the JEDEC standard PCB and copper-spreading area, and is used as a relative measure of package thermal performance.

### 8.1.6.1 Thermal Performance Versus Copper Area

The most used thermal resistance parameter  $R_{\theta JA}$  is highly dependent on the heat-spreading capability built into the particular PCB design, and therefore varies according to the total copper area, copper weight, and location of the planes. The  $R_{\theta JA}$  recorded in the *Thermal Information* table is determined by the JEDEC standard (see 图 8-1), PCB, and copper-spreading area, and is only used as a relative measure of package thermal performance. For a well-designed thermal layout,  $R_{\theta JA}$  is actually the sum of the package junction-to-case (bottom) thermal resistance ( $R_{\theta JCbot}$ ) plus the thermal resistance contribution by the PCB copper.

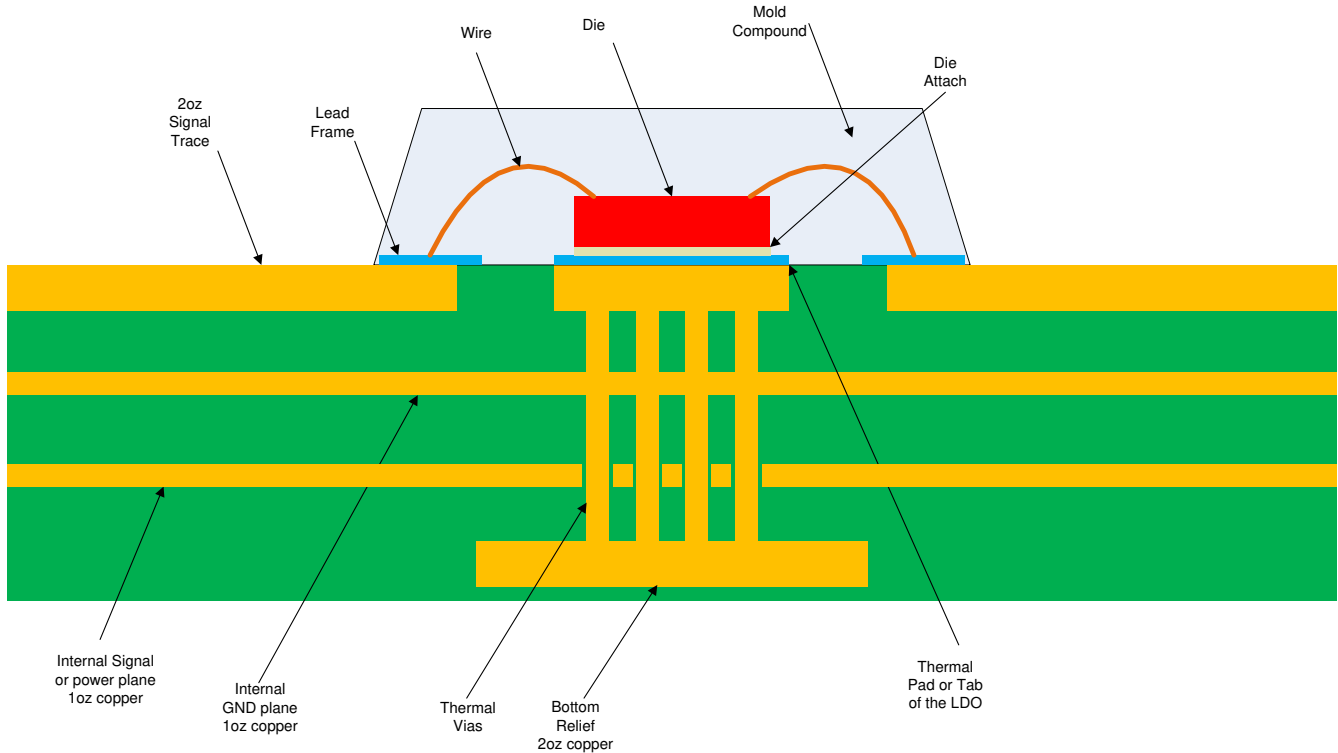


图 8-1. JEDEC Standard 2s2p PCB

图 8-2 through 图 8-5 illustrate the functions of  $R_{\theta JA}$  and  $\psi_{JB}$  versus copper area and thickness. These plots are generated with a 101.6-mm × 101.6-mm × 1.6-mm PCB of two and four layers. For the 4-layer board, inner planes use 1-oz copper thickness. Outer layers are simulated with both 1-oz and 2-oz copper thickness. A 2x3 (DDA package) or a 3x4 (KVU package) array of thermal vias with a 300- $\mu$ m drill diameter and 25- $\mu$ m copper plating is located beneath the thermal pad of the device. The thermal vias connect the top layer, the bottom layer and, in the case of the 4-layer board, the first inner GND plane. Each of the layers has a copper plane of equal area.

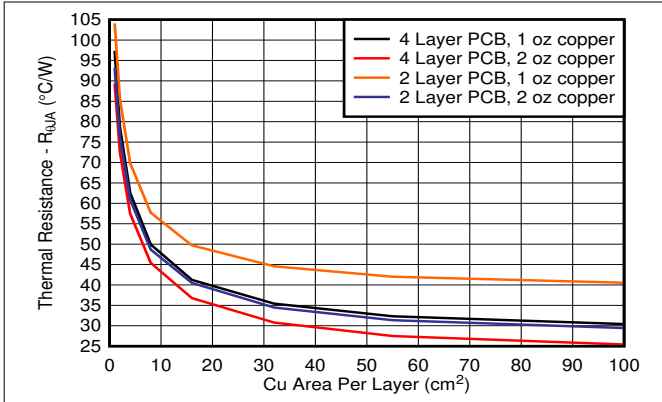


图 8-2.  $R_{\theta JA}$  vs Copper Area (DDA Package)

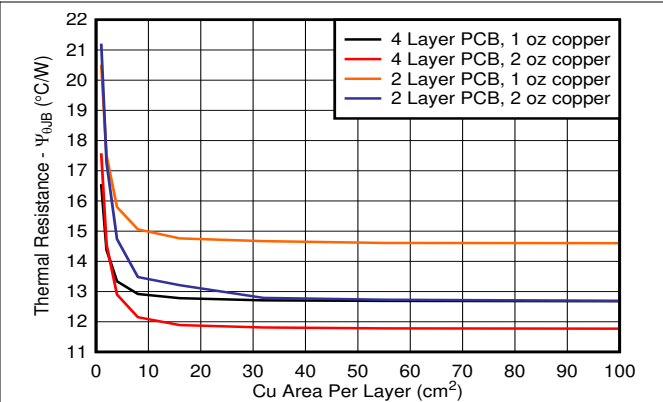


图 8-3.  $\psi_{JB}$  vs Copper Area (DDA Package)

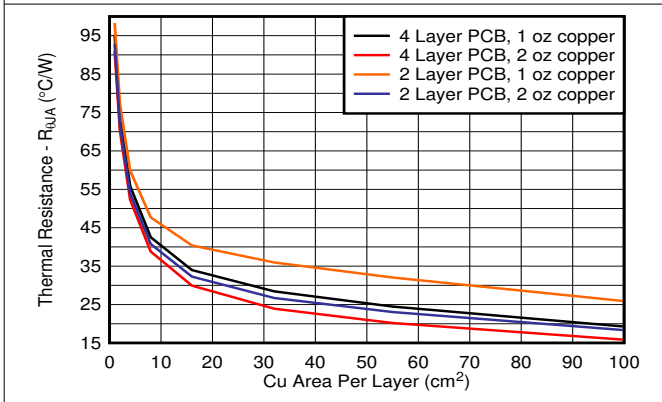


图 8-4.  $R_{\theta JA}$  vs Copper Area (KVU Package)

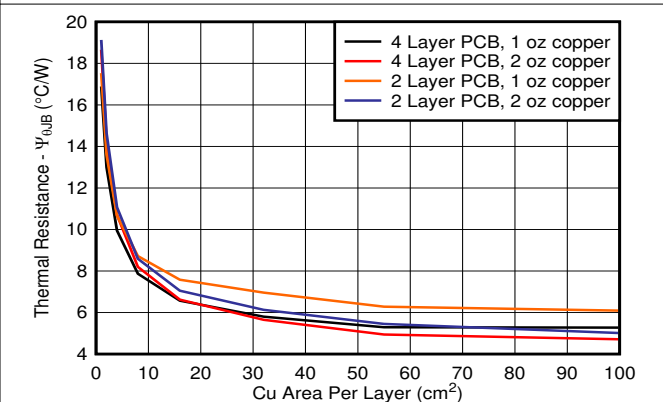


图 8-5.  $\psi_{JB}$  vs Copper Area (KVU Package)

**8.1.6.2 Power Dissipation Versus Ambient Temperature**

图 8-6 is based off of a JEDEC 4-layer, high-K board. The allowable power dissipation was estimated using the following equation. As discussed in the [An empirical analysis of the impact of board layout on LDO thermal performance application note](#), thermal dissipation can be improved in the JEDEC high-K layout by adding top layer copper and increasing the number of thermal vias. If a good thermal layout is used, the allowable thermal dissipation can be improved by up to 50%.

$$T_A + R_{\theta JA} \times P_D \leq 150 \text{ } ^\circ\text{C} \tag{8}$$

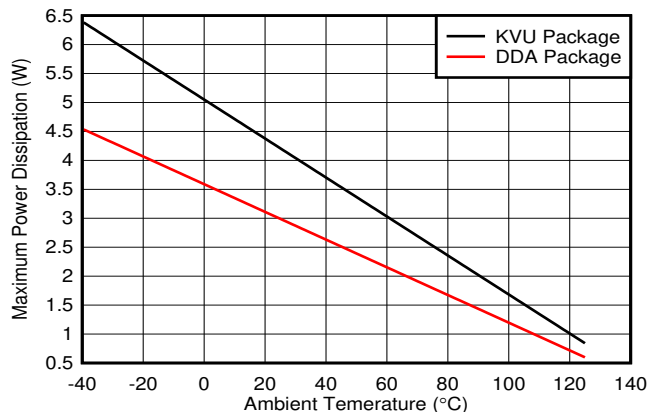


图 8-6. TPS7B86-Q1 Allowable Power Dissipation



### 8.1.7 Estimating Junction Temperature

The JEDEC standard now recommends the use of psi ( $\Psi$ ) thermal metrics to estimate the junction temperatures of the linear regulator when in-circuit on a typical PCB board application. These metrics are not thermal resistance parameters and instead offer a practical and relative way to estimate junction temperature. These psi metrics are determined to be significantly independent of the copper area available for heat-spreading. The [Thermal Information](#) table lists the primary thermal metrics, which are the junction-to-top characterization parameter ( $\psi_{JT}$ ) and junction-to-board characterization parameter ( $\psi_{JB}$ ). These parameters provide two methods for calculating the junction temperature ( $T_J$ ), as described in the following equations. Use the junction-to-top characterization parameter ( $\psi_{JT}$ ) with the temperature at the center-top of device package ( $T_T$ ) to calculate the junction temperature. Use the junction-to-board characterization parameter ( $\psi_{JB}$ ) with the PCB surface temperature 1 mm from the device package ( $T_B$ ) to calculate the junction temperature.

$$T_J = T_T + \psi_{JT} \times P_D \quad (9)$$

where:

- $P_D$  is the dissipated power
- $T_T$  is the temperature at the center-top of the device package

$$T_J = T_B + \psi_{JB} \times P_D \quad (10)$$

where

- $T_B$  is the PCB surface temperature measured 1 mm from the device package and centered on the package edge

## 8.1.8 Power-Good

### 8.1.8.1 Setting the Adjustable Power-Good Delay

The power-good delay time can be set in two ways: either by floating the DELAY pin or by connecting a capacitor from this pin to GND. When the DELAY pin is floating, the time defaults to  $t_{(DLY\_FIX)}$ . The delay time is set by the following equation if a capacitor is connected between the DELAY pin and GND.

$$t = t_{(DLY\_FIX)} + C_{DELAY} \left( \frac{V_{DLY(TH)}}{I_{DLY(CHARGE)}} \right) \quad (11)$$

## 8.2 Typical Application

图 8-7 shows a typical application circuit for the TPS7B86-Q1. TI recommends a low-ESR ceramic capacitor with a dielectric of type X5R or X7R.

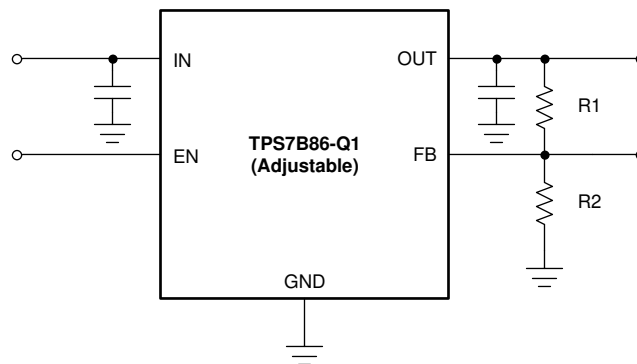


图 8-7. Typical Application Schematic for the TPS7B86-Q1

### 8.2.1 Design Requirements

### 8.2.2 Detailed Design Procedure

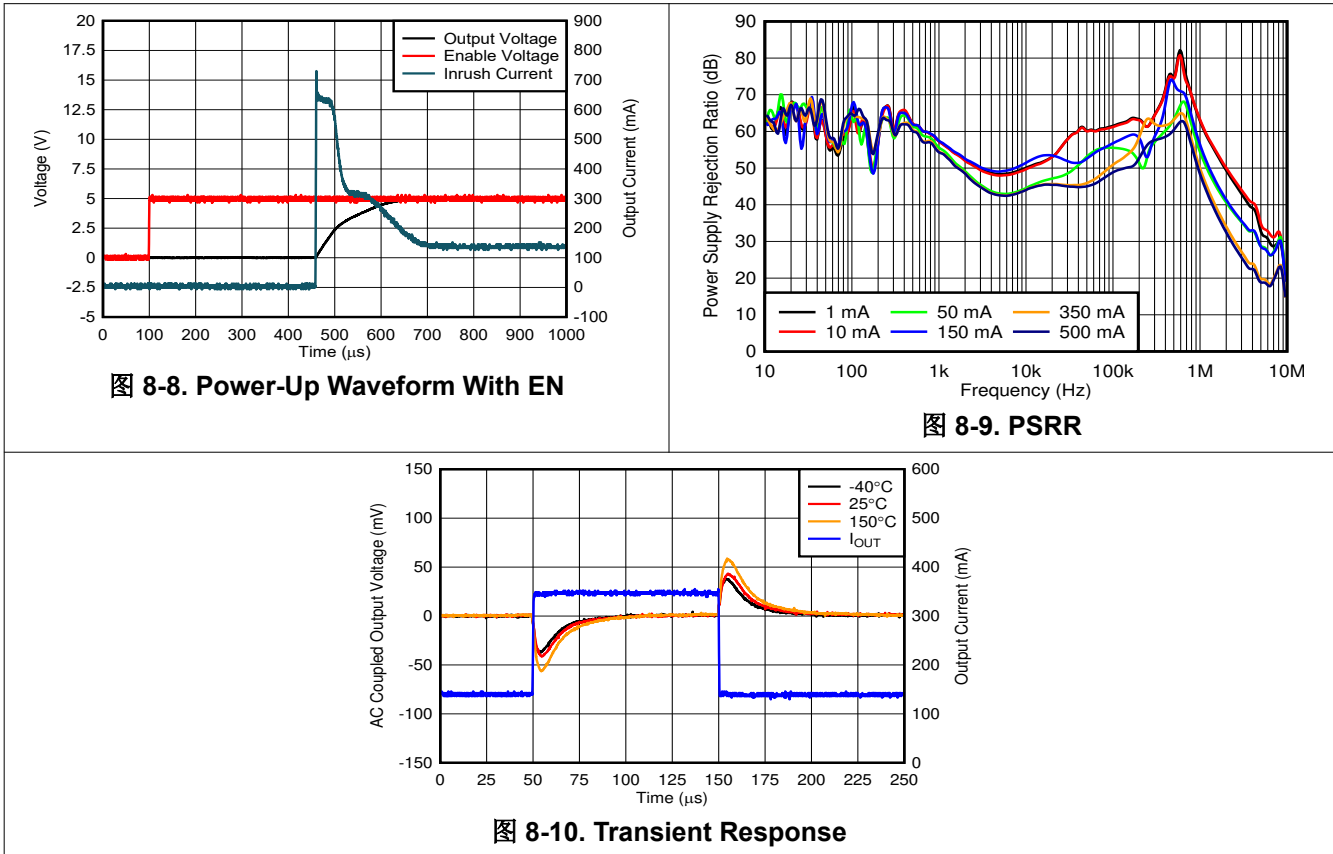
#### 8.2.2.1 Input Capacitor

The device requires an input decoupling capacitor, the value of which depends on the application. The typical recommended value for the decoupling capacitor is 1  $\mu$ F. The voltage rating must be greater than the maximum input voltage.

#### 8.2.2.2 Output Capacitor

The device requires an output capacitor to stabilize the output voltage. The capacitor value must be between 2.2  $\mu$ F and 200  $\mu$ F and the ESR range must be between 1 m $\Omega$  and 2  $\Omega$ . For this design, a low ESR, 10- $\mu$ F ceramic capacitor was used to improve transient performance.

### 8.3 Power Supply Recommendations

This device is designed for operation from an input voltage supply with a range between 3 V and 40 V. This input supply must be well regulated. If the input supply is located more than a few inches from the TPS7B86-Q1, add an electrolytic capacitor with a value of 22 μF and a ceramic bypass capacitor at the input.

### 8.4 Layout

#### 8.4.1 Layout Guidelines

For best overall performance, place all circuit components on the same side of the circuit board and as near as practical to the respective LDO pin connections. Place ground return connections to the input and output capacitor, and to the LDO ground pin as close as possible to each other, connected by a wide, component-side, copper surface. The use of vias and long traces to the input and output capacitors is strongly discouraged and negatively affects system performance. TI also recommends a ground reference plane either embedded in the PCB or located on the bottom side of the PCB opposite the components. This reference plane serves to assure accuracy of the output voltage, shield noise, and behaves similarly to a thermal plane to spread (or sink) heat from the LDO device when connected to the thermal pad. In most applications, this ground plane is necessary to meet thermal requirements.

##### 8.4.1.1 Package Mounting

Solder pad footprint recommendations for the TPS7B86-Q1 are available at the end of this document and at [www.ti.com](http://www.ti.com).

#### 8.4.1.2 Board Layout Recommendations to Improve PSRR and Noise Performance

As depicted in [图 8-11](#) and [图 8-12](#), place the input and output capacitors close to the device for the layout of the TPS7B86-Q1. In order to enhance the thermal performance, place as many vias as possible around the device. These vias improve the heat transfer between the different GND planes in the PCB.

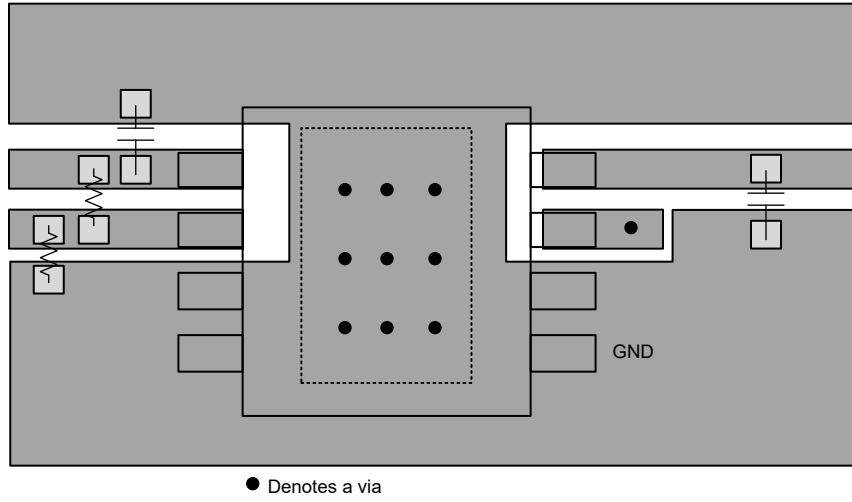
To improve AC performance such as PSRR, output noise, and transient response, use a board design with separate ground planes for  $V_{IN}$  and  $V_{OUT}$ , with each ground plane connected only at the GND pin of the device. In addition, the ground connection for the output capacitor must connect directly to the GND pin of the device.

Minimize equivalent series inductance (ESL) and ESR in order to maximize performance and ensure stability. Place each capacitor as close as possible to the device and on the same side of the PCB as the regulator.

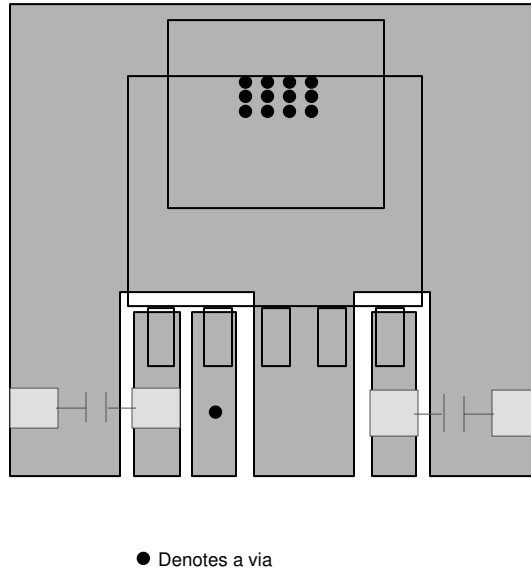
Do not place any of the capacitors on the opposite side of the PCB from where the regulator is installed. Do not use vias or long traces to connect the capacitors because they may negatively affect system performance and even cause instability.

If possible, and to ensure the maximum performance specified in this document, use the same layout pattern used for the TPS7B86-Q1 evaluation board, available at [www.ti.com](http://www.ti.com).

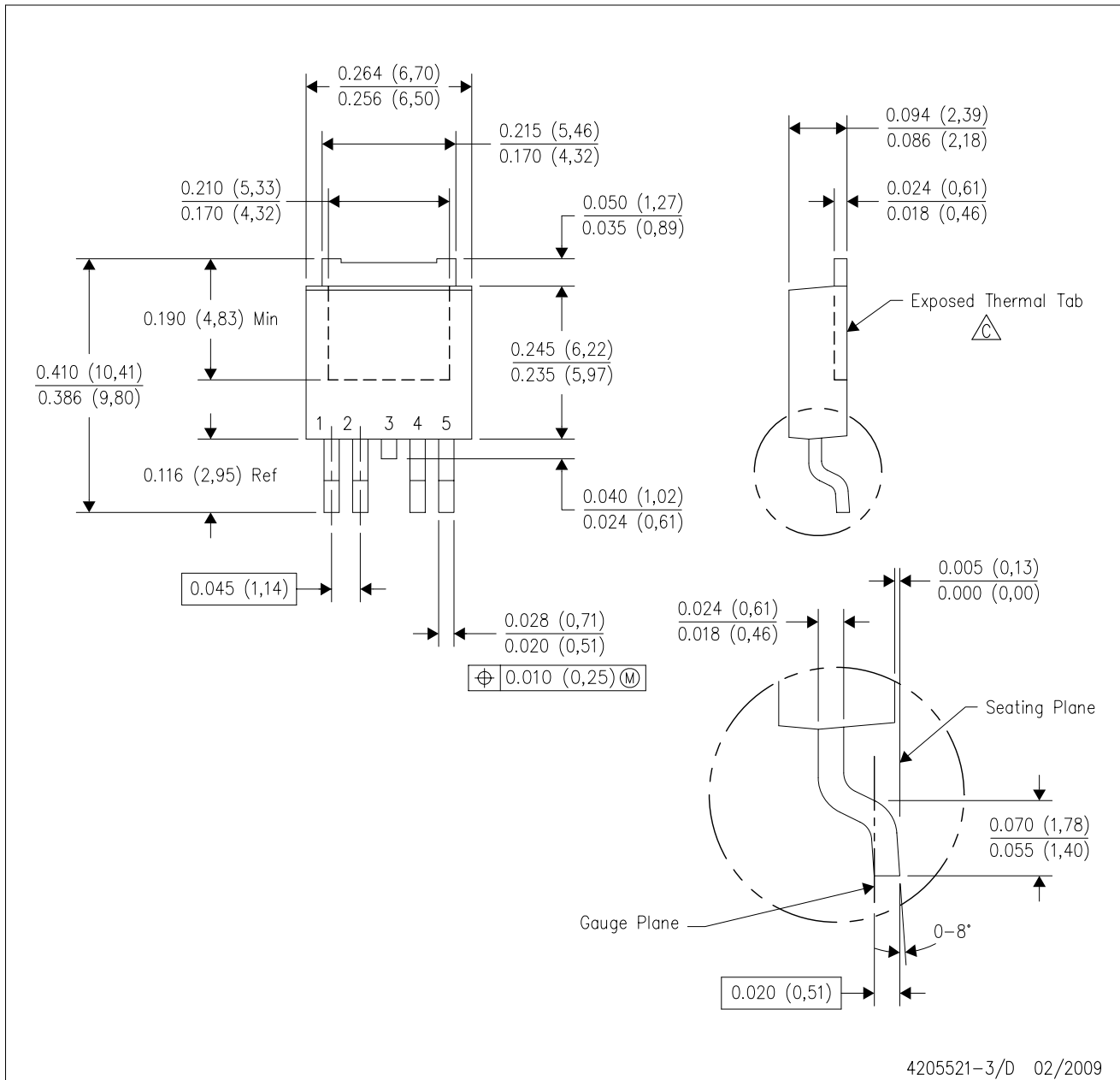

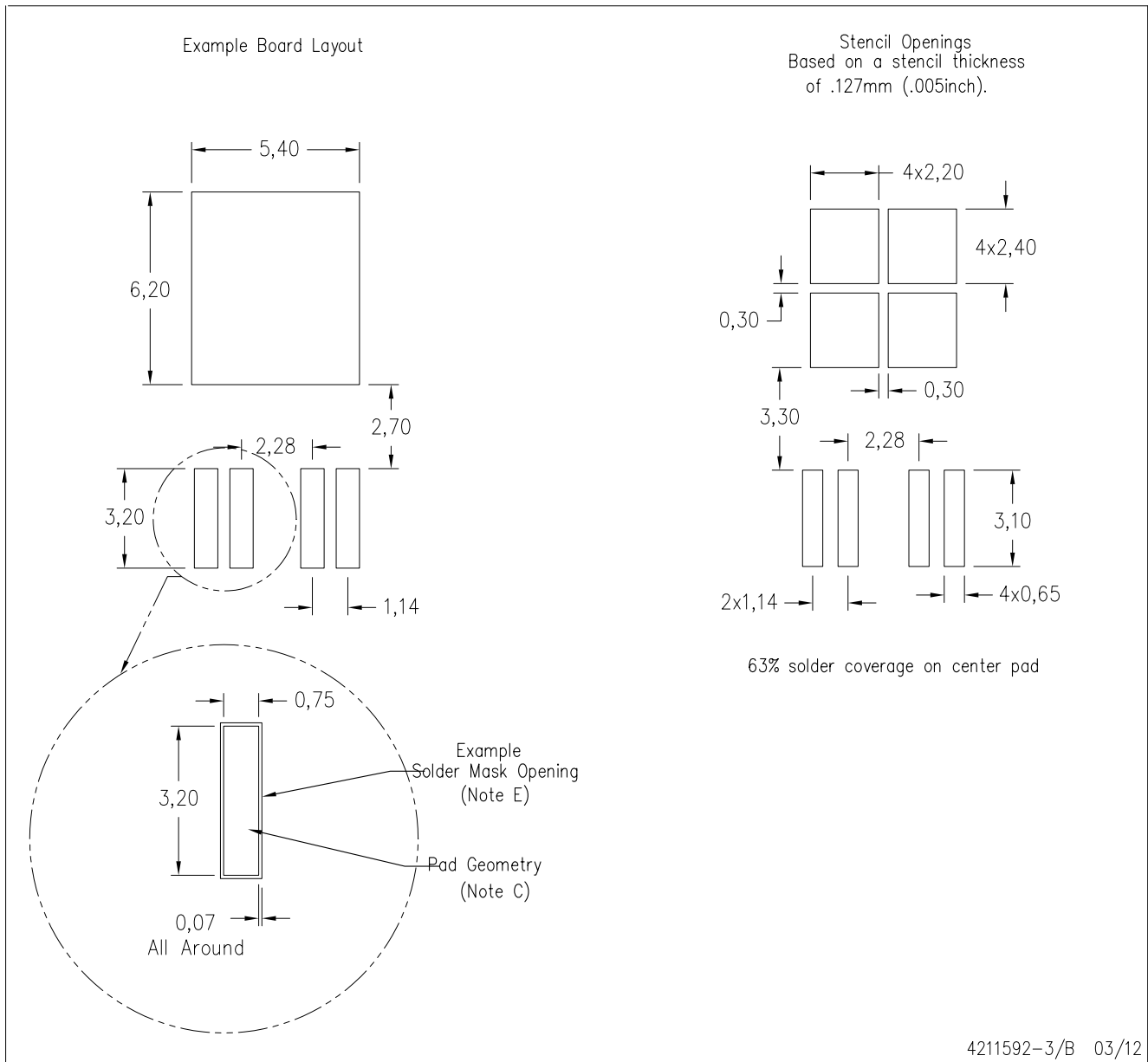

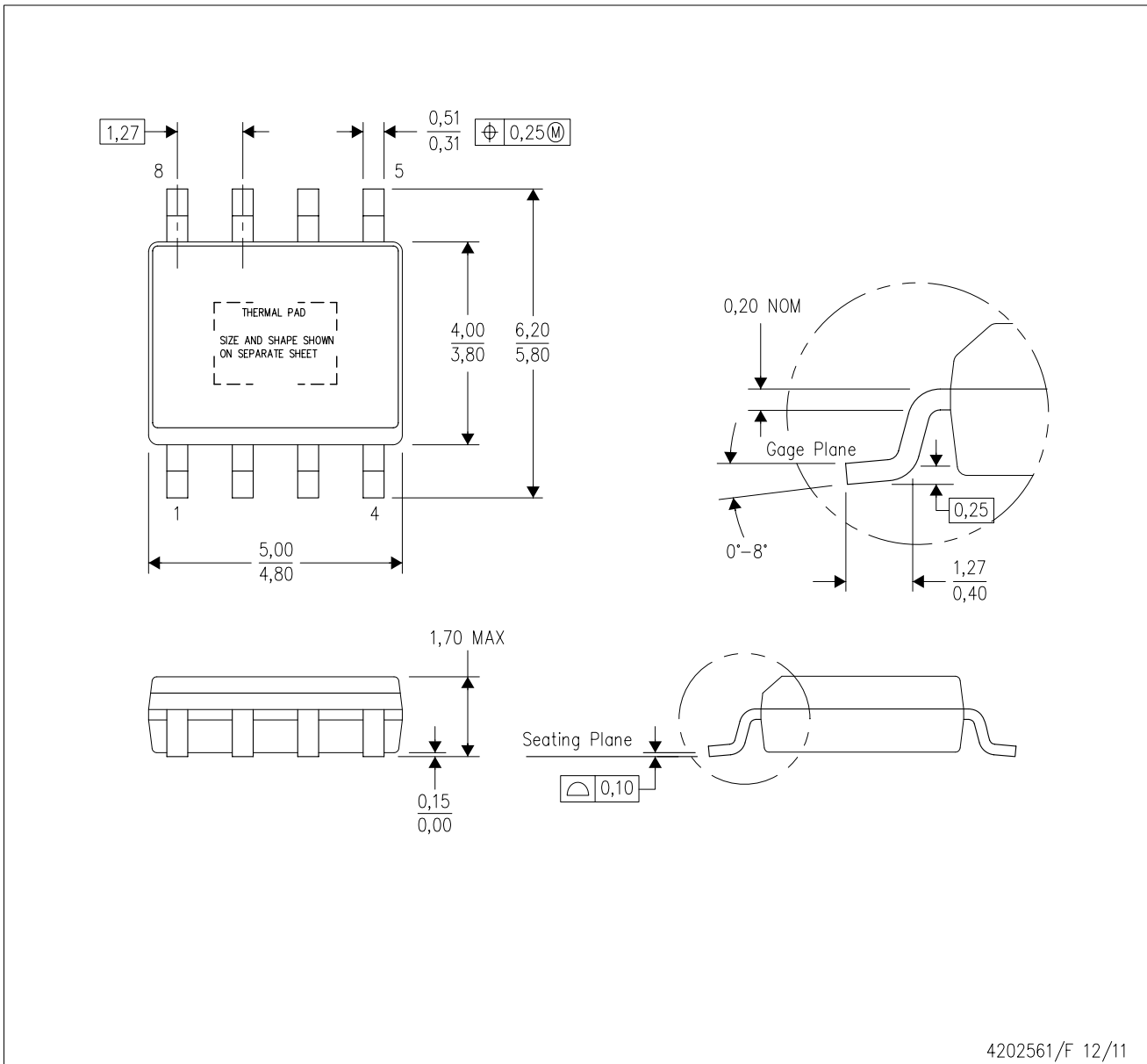

## THERMAL INFORMATION

This PowerPAD™ package incorporates an exposed thermal pad that is designed to be attached to a printed circuit board (PCB). The thermal pad must be soldered directly to the PCB. After soldering, the PCB can be used as a heatsink. In addition, through the use of thermal vias, the thermal pad can be attached directly to the appropriate copper plane shown in the electrical schematic for the device, or alternatively, can be attached to a special heatsink structure designed into the PCB. This design optimizes the heat transfer from the integrated circuit (IC).
